April 1913 - the Club distributed 2,000 packets of seeds to school children for planting.
April 21, 1925 - having made the last payment, the Club burned the Mortgage at the Charter Luncheon.
Spring 1960 - the Club started a wildflower trail and planted 4 dogwood trees in Riverton Park.
May 22, 1983 - the Mayor of Riverton declared this date as "Porch Club Day in Riverton" in honor of the Club's 93rd birthday, and to help promote the first Porch-Party fundraiser.
