In support of this year's International charity, the Porch Club raised \$350.00 for The Book Wish Foundation. These funds will help support library development in the 12 refugee camps in eastern Chad, Africa that are home to nearly 285,000 Darfuri refugees from neighboring Sudan. More than half of the refugees are children. These funds help supply books in the languages they can read. This support is critical if the refugees are to receive the education they dream of and the mental escape they need.

Continued support can be achieved by purchasing the book, "What You Wish

For", a collection of stories and poems contributed pro bono by famous authors. The Book Wish Foundation is giving 100% of the book proceeds to the UN Refugee Agency, UNHCR, to fund the libraries. The book can be purchased on Amazon.com.

An acknowledgement of appreciation was received from last year's International campaign, Mycharity: Water. The \$400.00 collected has been sent to the field to help supply water in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and Cote d'Ivoire.

Looking Back

April 1895 - the Porch Club was formally organized. The Constitution and by-laws were passed and adopted; Mrs. Mary Van Meter Grice was elected first President.

April 1904 - Porch Club meetings had grown too big for Mrs. Ogden's porch, so on April 4, the first meeting was held in the Rudderow building, which the Porch Club rented for \$12.00 per year. Membership increased to 100; dues were \$3. A Suffrage Section and the 1st House Committee were formed.

May 1909 - the Clubhouse at 4th & Howard was officially occupied.

May 1911 - on May 11, the first Charter luncheon was given.
