Mary was one of eight young women who were Charter Members of The Porch Club in 1890 and who was it's first president from 1895-1897 when the club joined the Federation of Women's clubs. She was also the first president of the NJ State PTA, which was formed through the efforts of the Porch Club, a published author, president of the Home and School League in Philadelphia, and a social activist.

Pat will present a slide show about the life of this remarkable woman who was instrumental in the founding of this "center of thought and action for women" which led to such a rich heritage for Riverton and the community.

This will be a grand way to belatedly celebrate Women's History Month and to shine a bright light on The 125th Anniversary of the Porch Club.

"Crash: A Tale of Two Species: Red Knot Birds and Horseshoe Crabs"

On March 20, The Public Issues Committee hosted a discussion on Medical Identity Theft.

Our speaker was Jennifer Comerford, a member of the Porch Club, who is a Certified Healthcare Compliance Professional and an independent Medical Research Analyst with a Master of Jurisprudence Health Law from Widener University School of Law, a Bachelor of Science degree from Thomas Jefferson University, and a Master Certificate in Pediatric Occupational Therapy from Temple University.

Medical Identity Theft is a new kind of crime. Thieves steal your personal information and file fraudulent claims against your health insurance policy.

These medical thieves steal your health insurance number, Social Security number, and other personal information. Many times the information is stolen by employees at medical facilities and resold on the black market. Thieves also hack into medical databases or break into medical facilities.

Organized theft rings can set up fake clinics to make bogus claims against the health policies of honest consumers. They may use your identity to obtain prescription drugs to sell or feed their own addictions. Some Medical Identity thieves often receive free medical treatment by assuming your identity at a hospital or clinic and your policy receives the bill.


Medical Identity Theft can cause many long lasting problems including ruined credit, loss of health coverage, inaccurate records, legal problems, and higher health premiums.

There are ways to help prevent Medical Identity Theft. Always check the explanation of benefits form (EOB) sent by your health insurer. Notify your insurer and medical provider if you see treatments you never received. Monitor your insurance benefits annually, check your medical records, protect your credit, correct inaccurate medical records immediately, and file a police report to notify law enforcement that a crime may have been committed.

LOOKING BACK:

Honoring Mrs. Edward H. Ogden Porch Club President 1897-1901

Sarah Morris Perot was born on December 6, 1831 in Philadelphia to Francis Perot and Elizabeth Marshall Morris. Raised a Quaker, she was active in her "work of mercy". She was a member of the Pennsylvania Society of Colonial Dames of America, the Philadelphia Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution, and President of the Philadelphia Home for Incurables. She took part in other philanthropic work such as assisting the Pennsylvania Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children. She also served as President of the Riverton branch of the Needlework Guild of America for eighteen years.

Sarah Morris Perot married Edward H. Ogden on December 1, 1853, and later moved to Riverton, New Jersey. During the Civil War, Mrs. Ogden was a volunteer and a daily visitor to a Philadelphia military hospital. (Edward H. Ogden served as a Union soldier and became the first Mayor of Riverton in 1894.)

Many of the meetings of the Porch Club (then "Mothers' Circle") were held on the Ogden's front porch on Bank Avenue from 1890-1902. During the time that Mrs. Ogden served as Porch Club President (1897-1901), the Club formed the "Village Improvement Section" whose purpose was "to beautify Riverton, as Civic Clubs do in Philadelphia." The Section met weekly on Mondays. A "Study Section" was also formed. The club campaigned successfully to have the first woman (Mrs. Mary C. Grice) elected to the school board. The "Musical Section" was formed; the Porch Club membership enlarged to 50 members, and the executive committee was formed of officers and chairwomen, who served one-year terms. The "Mothers' Circle" issued a "Call" which resulted in the organization of the NJ Congress of Mothers (now the New Jersey PTA). The Porch Club joined the NJ Congress in 1901; dues were \$.10 per member. The Porch Club membership grew too large to continue meeting on the Ogden's porch, so a search was conducted to find a more suitable meeting location. In 1908, after Edward H. Ogden's death,

Mrs. Ogden gave the current Riverton Library building to the Library Association in her husband's name.

Mrs. Edward H. Ogden died on July 30, 1912. At her memorial, a Mrs. Mary B. H. Williams of Philadelphia said, "To endeavor to do justice to her great and enduring capacity for work is useless.... her service for others has been untiring...She was fearless where the truth was concerned. So today, we are the richer for her example and the poorer for our loss."

The focus project for 2015-16 is "What's So Scary About Smart Girls: World Wide Education for Girls". The committee has raised over \$600 thus far with the goal being \$1,000. The Riverton School Language Arts, Social Studies, and Art programs will jointly participate in this project. The teachers involved are very excited about the Riverton School/Porch Club Project, Change-for-Change. All 8th grade students will be involved.

Change-for-Change will expose students to the plight of girl's education in emerging countries through the school curriculum. It will also have students distribute boxes for the purpose of collecting "change" (much like the UNICEF trick or treat boxes). The money collected will then be given to the PC for our campaign.

Riverton School has asked members from our committee to kick off the project on April 13 when we will introduce segments of the film, "Girl Rising".
