

History Corner

Charles Goren – Teaching Bridge at The Porch Club

Charles H. Goren, Life Master of the American Contract Bridge League, began to give lessons at the Porch Club in 1936. What a thrill it must have been for the Porch Club ladies to learn Bridge from the world champion authority!


Born March 1, 1901 in Khityn, Ukraine, he practiced law for 13 years in Philadelphia. In 1934, Goren began his own Bridge writing career and published the first of his many books on playing bridge, "Winning Bridge Made Easy", in 1936. In 1935, he quit practicing law to focus entirely on Bridge.


Goren quickly became popular as an instructor and lecturer. He was the inventor of point count bidding which is still used today. He became the premier American Bridge authority and authored numerous bestselling books on the subject.

Goren dominated the competitive Bridge circuit, ultimately becoming the world champion at the Bermuda Bowl in 1950 and remained a competitive player until about 1962 after which he focused on writing and teaching Bridge.

His books have sold millions of copies and by 1958 his daily bridge column was appearing in 194 American newspapers He also appeared on the Groucho Marx radio and television game show "You Bet Your Life" in 1958 and the television game show "What's My Line" in 1961.
