



Trick or Treat for UNICEF is the longest running youth philanthropic activity in the United States. The tradition began in Philadelphia in 1950 when a youth group collected \$17 in decorated milk cartons on Halloween to help children left vulnerable by WW II. Fifty-eight years later, Trick or Treat for UNICEF has evolved from door to door collection on Halloween into a month long national fundraising program that has inspired children to save the lives of their peers around the world by raising more then \$136 million.

The **Kimberley Basket** supports our Child Fund International child, Kimberley Jones. Kimberley will celebrate a special birthday in November when she will be 10 years old. "Eat, Play, Live!: A Guide to Living a Long Life of Health & Balance" Monday, November 15, 2010 at 7:00




